





LHS Senior Blakely Barnes designed a Mango Language Learning Software display at the WCPL and visited rural communities on the Bookmobile to promote library outreach programs.



Firstly, we have a wonderful web site called Ancestry.com. This site is made free to the public thanks to a very generous memorial donation in memory of Mr. Joe C. Granade, who loved local family history. (How about that?) We also recently received a large collection of genealogy materials from the Wilcox Foundation that are being made available to the public in part by an Ala-Tom RCED grant! Soon you will be able to make an appointment with a staff member who will be more than happy to assist you with your research. (Meow). I will be happy to share my family's history with you; I will mention some of my more famous ancestors. It all started in Egypt (as far as I know) with the cat goddess Bastet. NEW GRANTS AWARDED

- **Alabama Public Library Service – LSTA Grant, \$10,000** – Visit our new Preschool area where learning is fun! A wall of interactive stations that feature developmental games, educational new books and puzzles will challenge your young learner's mind as they discover fun ways to learn and grow!

- **Ala-Tom RC&D - \$5,823 Community Grant** – This grant helped improve the Library's ability to promote programs and inform the public about valuable services available through WCPL, such as genealogy research software and family history resources! Stay tuned for details about the upcoming opening of our new Genealogy Research Room!



- **WC Board of Education - Bulldog Pride 21st Century Grant , \$8,000** – WCPL and WCHS partnered to provide amazing educational opportunities for students participating in Bulldog Pride afterschool tutoring. Students have enjoyed many new, exciting experiences through this partnership such as chemistry "slime" making, aerodynamics and aviation with the Mobile Airport Authority, and animal adaptations with the Hattiesburg Zoo! Exploreum will visit the school in May to explore science principles such as chemical reactions and vortexes. This summer, students will learn about (S.T.E.M.) educational concepts in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, and will be building electrical circuits!

- **Dollar General - \$10,000 Literacy Grant** – WCPL Bookmobile is back on the road thanks to this Literacy Outreach Grant! Bookmobile literacy visits to rural communities throughout Washington County! This grant allows us to reach out to people through the county with services and materials for the county nutrition center lending library program, home school families, adult continued education students, job search and employment skills, and GED test prep.




